Deterrence is / Smarter /



Make It Difficult For Criminals To Get Into Your Business. Locks, Lighting And Landscaping Are A Good First Step.

- Ensure all doors and windows are in good repair
- Install a deadbolt lock on each exterior door
- Lock overhead and receiving doors with high-quality padlocks
- Cover exterior windows with glazing it's more difficult to break
- Add window locks and/or pins to prevent easy opening from the outside
- Light all exterior entries with fixtures that are difficult to reach or tamper with



- Use LED lighting for lower installation and maintenance costs
- Trim heavy vegetation that obstructs views or could be used as a hiding place
- Add a fence as a first line of defense
- Ensure hidden areas are well protected. They are the most vulnerable areas of your business exterior

Be Aware Of What's Happening Inside Your Business Every Day

- Know who you're hiring. Run a background check before making a job offer
- Never have fewer than two people close up at night or monitor individual closings with video.
- Restrict who has access to your security system's arm and disarm codes
- Make bank deposit drops daily
- If providing keys, give them only to those employees who need them for their jobs
- Employ an access control system access cards are difficult to copy, cost less and are easier than keys to replace if lost or stolen
- Use security cameras to monitor areas where money is kept and where valuable equipment is used or stored. Cameras are a strong deterrent to employee theft
- Only minimal cash should be kept in a safe that's secured to the building's structure and illuminated at night

About 75 percent of employees steal from their employers and most do so repeatedly²



A Business Management Challenges

Security Risks Can Weigh on a Business Owner. These Tips can Help Keep Your Business Safe and Thriving.

- Introduce your business to the local police department's community liaison or crime prevention officer and ask what services they can provide
- Make sure your employees are trained on emergency procedures, then perform regular drills
- Keep your emergency contact list updated
- Test your security systems monthly to make sure they are working properly
- Review your open/close reports the first week of every month to look for irregularities.
- Review video of new employees during their first two weeks on the job for 15 minutes at the end of the day to help ensure safety procedures are being followed
- Ensure there are checks and balances in the cash flow of your business to avoid the catastrophic impact of embezzlement



A Workplace Violence

Workplace Violence Can Have A Major Impact On Employees And Customers. It Can Even Cost You Your Business

- Develop a zero tolerance policy for verbal abuse or physical assault – take all threats seriously
- Train supervisors to look for the warning signs of workplace violence
- Immediately take keys or deactivate access cards from terminated employees
- Incorporate panic buttons into your intrusion detection solution
- Install a video intercom to see who wants access to your business or a restricted area
- Potentially defuse volatile situations by listening and not escalating emotions. Ask the agitated party how they think the issue should be resolved

Here's A Checklist To Further Enhance Your Physical And Organizational Security

- An intrusion detection system may help protect your business around the clock
- Use access control to protect high-value asset areas such as inventory storerooms or customer/ employee data files
- Install video cameras to monitor entrance and exit points and other critical locations inside and outside your facility
- Install motion detectors to sense movement inside the building
- Install point protectors (such as pressureswitch mats) to detect when someone enters a restricted area, such as by a business office or safe deposit room
